Guidelines for Contributors

The following guidelines are to be adhered, while submitting the manuscript:

1. A softcopy of the manuscript should be submitted in English, with MS Word format and double-spaced with adequate margins on both sides. It should be accompanied with biographical sketch of all the authors and should be sent to editor@pimrindore.ac.in.
2. Each manuscript should be accompanied by a declaration by the author that the research paper/article has neither been published nor submitted for publication elsewhere. The declaration form is available on the institute website (<http://pimrindore.ac.in/i-Journal.html>). This declaration form should be downloaded and the scanned copy of duly signed filled declaration form should be sent to the email id - editor@pimrindore.ac.in.
3. Every manuscript must include an abstract. The manuscript should be accompanied by: a cover page comprising of article title, authors' name and affiliation, mailing address, mobile number/phone, fax and email address (authors' name should not appear anywhere else in the manuscript); in case of multiple authors, the cover page should indicate the author to whom correspondence should be addressed.
4. The full length article/paper should be around 3000-5000 words. The abstract of the paper should not be more than 200 words with at least five key words.
5. Use a single column layout with left and right margins justified. The font for the main text of the article should be in Times Roman, 12 pt.
6. Titles should be in upper the lower case letters, 16 point Times New Roman, bold and flush to the left margin. Titles should be left-justified.
7. Tables, figures and graphs (charts) presented in the text should be in black and white only. The tables and figures (complete with titles, labels and art-work) mentioned in the

text should appear near/after they are referred. The diagrams, graphs, etc. should be sent in original and should not appear in separate document files.

8. The endnotes should be serially numbered and should be provided before the references in 10 point Times New Roman.
9. References should be given separately at the end of the paper and the entries should be arranged alphabetically. The word 'References' should appear as a first-level heading. The list should include only the work the author/s have cited. The following style should be strictly followed :
